Catalogue Notes:

Vladimir Ovchinnikov was a leading member of the Leningrad unofficial art movement beginning in the 1960s. He was involved in many of the movement's landmark events, including the Exhibition of Workmen Artists held at the Hermitage Museum in 1964, which was open for only two days before being closed by the KGB. Ovchinnikov never received formal art training, although he worked as an assistant stage designer at the Kirov Theater in Leningrad. In the mid-1970s, Ovchinnikov participated in the first officially-sanctioned exhibition of nonconformist art in Leningrad. He was a member of the St. Petersburg Group of Painters, led by Mikhail Chemiakin. Ovchinnikov's scenes are drawn from the life of the Leningrad suburbs. His distinctive, simplified, naïve style employs full-bodied tubular figures, resembling toys made out of polished wooden blocks. Since his figures display no emotion, the artist's intentions are conveyed through gesture, the careful deployment of figures and objects, and artful theatrical spotlighting.

Nikolai Gritsuk was born in the small village of Preobrazhenka in 1922. Seriously injured in the fighting in Austria in 1945, he nonetheless successfully completed his studies at the Fine Art department of the Moscow Textile Institute. He returned to his native Siberia, this time to Novosibirsk, in 1953. Initially, Gritsuk painted from nature but, over time, he became more inspired by the abstract form and this became the basis of his work. His preoccupation with overcoming seclusion stems from his geographical remoteness, combined with his artistic isolation as one of the few abstract painters of the 1960s in the USSR.







The Takis Efstathiou Book Collection Lot 111 - 181



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Takis Efstathiou (b. 1944) is a well-known fine art dealer. He is associated with the largest private and public collections in the world's art capitals, and has received acknowledgement in many exhibition catalogs of museums and galleries.

Takis Efstathiou arrived in New York in 1963, he was engaged with various art-related activities: studying theater in studios, assisting the artist Nikos Icaris, experimenting with painting and photography. Towards the end of 1960 Efstathiou met Alexander Iolas, who encouraged him to engage with the art market, a field in which Efstathiou excelled. Initially, in 1973 Efstathiou opened Tchernov Gallery in Manhattan's 57th Street, next to Carnegie Hall. This Gallery commemorates his grandmother's maiden name. There he presented works by American artists, with the exception of the first major exhibition of Christos Caras in 1974. Tchernov Gallery was closed in 1975 as a result of the pressures of the Cold War. Subsequently, he began private dealing with major collections in Japan, until 1977, when he opened Ericson Gallery on Madison Avenue and 74th Street, near The Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Guggenheim. There he displayed historic exhibitions featuring works of Steve Gianakos, Hans Hinterreiter, Claes Oldenburg, Betty Parsons, Larry Rivers, Theodoros Stamos, and others. Ericson Gallery lasted eight years, until 1986, when Efstathiou turned towards dealing with collections and major art institutions.

Efstathiou has also been advisor to the Hans Hinterreiter Foundation in Zurich. Furthermore, Thomas Messer, director emeritus of the Guggeheim Foundation, collaborated with Efstathiou on the de-accession of artworks in the 1980s. Through the hands of Efstathiou passed works by Marc Chagall, Robert Delaunay, Rudolf Bauer, Baroness Hilla Rebay, Jacques Villon, and others. At various times Efstathiou has supported The Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Guggenheim Museum, the Brooklyn Museum, the Herbert Johnson Museum, and other American institutions with significant gifts. Theodoros Stamos introduced Lafcadio Hearn work to Takis Efstathiou when Efstathiou was collaborating with Stamos on upcoming exhibitions in Japan. Takis Efstathiou has been collecting Lafcadio Hearn books and objects for over 30 years and has made significant donations to the Met Museum, The Morgan Library and Museum, the Lafcadio Hearn Memorial Museum in Matsue, the Dublin's Writers Museum in Ireland, the Museum of Asian Art in Corfu, the American College of Greece, and other museums and institutions around the world. Furthermore, with his donations he established the Lafcadio Hearn Historical Center in Lefkada, Lafcadio's birthplace.

BEFORE THE AUCTION

1. Estimate of Items

1.1 All the items offered for sale are valued by Loudos Auctions based on the expected hammer price which is determined by Loudos Auctions experience and specialists and on past results of similar items. It is possible that the estimate and description are revised prior to the auction. Changes are published on Loudos Auctions website.

2. Description of Items

2.1 Items up for auction are presented with photographs and descriptions on loudos.gr. The description is worded according to the best of Loudos Auctions knowledge and based on detailed research.

2.2 The items up for auction are of an age and that often mean they are in worn, repaired or damaged condition. Everything is sold as used and "as is". The Auctioneer and his associates bear no responsibility for any possible defects, imperfections, damages or wear and tear on an item.

2.3 In some cases, Loudos Auctions may choose to describe an item's provenance. Such a description is provided if a former owner is publicly known and/or if the story of previous ownership sheds further light on the item and its background. 7. Amounts added to the hammer price.

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
